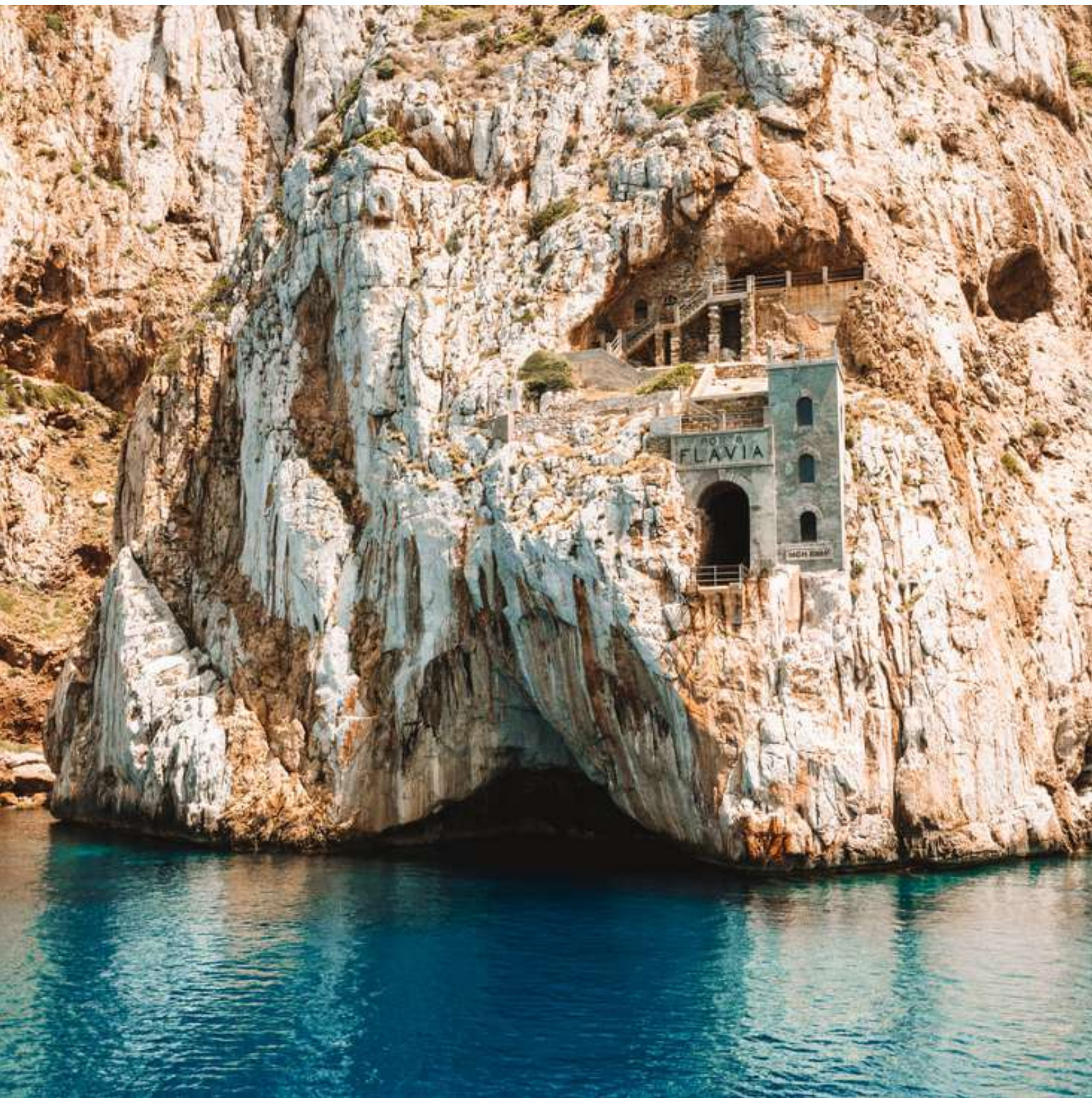

IS ARENAS

Is Arenas beach is situated in Narbolia. It is almost 6 kilometres long, one of the longest beaches of the province of Oristano, and it is called with this name for the presence of huge dunes. Since the beginnings of the XX Century pinetrees and thorn trees have been planted. The coastline is characterized by sand with shades of yellow and red with golden reflections mixed to pebbles and shells. In some places the beach has got grains like rice. The landscape is enriched by Montiferru woods. Towards the sea you can see Capu Mannu, where the Sinis Peninsula begins. It is an ideal place for people who love windsurf.

PUTZU IDU

Putzu Idu offers a beach with fine, white sand with greyish hues. IS ARUTAS

Is Arutas beach stretches for several kilometers, it has a clear sea which colors are between green and blue. It is known as the beach of the grains of rice, being composed of small grains of quartz. Is Arutas, as well as the nearby beaches of Mari Ermi and Maimoni, differ from the other coasts of Sardinia, because composed of porphyritic granite instead of the common calcareous rock. The seabed consists of colourful quartz grains which are the result of a long chemical evolution and atmospheric processing. This corner of Sardinia is unique and wild. It provides the basic services, but it is a destination far from the mass tourism. All these aspects make the beach of Is Arutas even more fascinating.

TORRE DEI CORSARI

The beach, along the magnificent Costa Verde, is made up of ochre-coloured sand, hemmed by tall dunes, lapped by a turquoise-green sea. The beach stretches for around 1.5 kilometres up to the locality of Pistis. The bright golden colour of the sand strongly contrasts with the surrounding landscape, with sprays of green from the thick Mediterranean brush that covers the hills on the three sides of the hinterland (north, east and south). Its waters are of a changing blue due to the plays of light created by the sun reflected on the seabed.

PISCINAS

Located in an isolated zone and of great naturalistic beauty, the beach of Piscinas, along the seashore of the Costa Verde, is surrounded for some kilometres by tall dunes (among the tallest in Europe), still alive and modelled by the mistral wind, its yellow ochre colour occasionally interrupted by bushes of prickly esparto, thorny carrot, sea lily and, more inland, junipers and old olives that form small groves. A flora-fauna territory of great interest, the ideal environment for long walks on the sand, especially in the early hours of the morning, when it is even possible to glimpse the deer that actually go down to the sea and, in the month of June, the sea turtles that lay their eggs.

CALA DOMESTICA

Set in a wild corner of the SW coast, among white calcareous cliffs, the inlet of Cala Domestica delights the eyes of the spectator with a beach covered in fine sand mixed with gravel, with rocks dotted all around, as well as being hemmed in by dunes punctuated by rich scented vegetation in stark chromatic contrast with the unbelievable blue of the sea. The beach is found in a mining zone, and therefore on view, are the ruins of the buildings associated with the nearby mines. The area is particularly loved by scuba fishing enthusiasts or simply by those wishing to take a dip in its uncontaminated waters, perhaps with a mask and flippers to discover the treasures that are hidden below the waterline.

MASUA

Pan di Zuccheru is a particularly interesting surfacing rock: detached from the Nai mountain, the large crag is 133 meters high and has two natural arches, one of which is navigable with a small boat through a tunnel of evocative sensations. The beach of Masua has sand mixed with gravel, with rocks dotted around, but especially near the water's edge. The beach is very wide and the area offers numerous facilities: it has a large car park, cafe, eating areas and has shallow waters, allowing children to freely play in them. It is also a much loved spot for those just wanting to do some scuba fishing or simply by those wanting to dive in its waters, perhaps with a mask and flippers, to admire its underwater world rich in pleasant surprises.

**PORTO PAGLIETTO**

The beach Portopaglietto (Portupaleddu in Sardinian), is the town beach of the town of Portoscuso, a small town of about 5000 inhabitants in the province of Carbonia-Iglesias, in the SW of Sardinia. The beach is a small stretch of about 200 meters by 25, with white sand amber, soft, fine, set in a small bay bordered by two cliffs, one of which stands the Tower of Portoscuso. The sea is clear, the color is pale blue, from shallow and sandy bottom. There is the presence of some rocks at the edge, close to the cliffs. And 'well-protected from the wind, and they happen to meet a few beached seagrass. Behind the beach Portopaglietto, winding streets of the village, behind which stands a small pine forest. In front of the beach you can admire the rock called La Ghinghetta.
