Murtas beach is situated in the territory of Vllaputzu, along the east coast of Sardinia, north of Muravera and Costa Rei. A beautiful beach that has the particularity of residing in a military area, which however retreats in the summer months, to give bathers from all over the world the opportunity to live and enjoy this corner of paradise.

The sea area between Capo Bellavista 39.929038, 9.719338 to Capo San Lorenzo 39.490477, 9.687066 is in fact prohibited for navigation and anchoring from October to May for military exercises. The military zone occupies an area of about 2000 hectares and extends for almost 50 km along the south-eastern stretch of the Sardinian coast, between Capo Bellavista, to the north, and Capo San Lorenzo, to the south.

A still wild beach, thanks also to its inaccessibility that lasted decades, but above all a not crowded one at all, even in high season. An hidden gem where privacy and interpersonal distance are not a problem. Anchoring allowed only from June to September. It is recommended anchoring in the northern part of the beach 39.530010, 9.650974 and not near the Poligono pier in the southern part of Murtas Beach.

From October to May: All naval units that, due to proven reasons of force majeure, need to cross the aforementioned area can be expressly authorized by this Maritime Authority and contact the Capo San Lorenzo shooting range on VHF channel 16. Any changes to the program of the aforementioned military exercises will be promptly communicated by this Maritime Authority, which will arrange for an additional ordering device.
